

Greetings from our Executive Principal

Dear Parents / carers
I can't start our Newsletter this month without a comment first on the weather that so disrupted us at the end of the month.

The "Beast from the East" delivered exactly what the Met Office had predicted and brought huge disruption to large parts of the UK.



I am sorry to say that this meant that I had to take the decision, along with hundreds of other school leaders up and down the country, to close the Academy for 3 days. This is never a decision that is made lightly and is based on a very careful risk assessment of the weather and the safety of travel conditions, access to the school site and the ability of staff to travel in, in enough numbers to provide safe and proper supervision. In the case of last week, it was



clear after consulting with transport and my site teams that the risk of asking children and staff to travel was too great and hence we closed. I hope that making the decisions early for Thursday and Friday gave parents and carers as much clarity and warning as possible so that arrangements could be made on those days. Let us hope that that was the last of the winter weather and that there will be no further disruption.

We are over half way through the year now and very soon will be moving more of our students to our new homes. I know that Ann-Marie Walker the Principal of the new site in South Leeds has already been in contact with many of you about the arrangements for transfer and transition and that Sarah Storer at Burley Park and Paul Carney at Stonegate have also been working with students and parents in preparation for the closure of their respective sites.

Change and transitions can be a worrying time for children and for parents, so if you have any worries, questions or concerns that you would like to discuss, please, please get in touch with staff at the site your child currently attends so that we can work with you to address those issues.

Finally – here is a link that may interest you as it very much reflects our approach to dealing with our children and young people. We refer to it as “Unconditional Positive Regard” and the link is to an article in the Guardian about our Springwell Academy in Barnsley and explains what Unconditional Positive Regard is and why it is the approach we believe works best.

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


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Oakwood News

Burley Park News




Green group went to town to create an Egyptian tomb from a store cupboard for the unit The Egyptians.

DJ School



