#### **Parent Pop-In**

Parents who have attended have really enjoyed some time focused on themselves as well as getting to know other parents in the Springwell North community. We have had lovely breakfasts and therapeutic craft activities on offer alongside a session by one of our external providers. During our last session we were joined by our Educational Psychologist who discussed windows of tolerance. Members of Scope will be present to discuss all aspects of sleep and associated challenges faced by families and young people.



### **Enterprise Fair**

In February we had a very successful enterprise fair in Primary and KS3. As part of the Element's curriculum students had to design, make and market a product of their choice to sell at a school marketplace. As part of this topic students learned about human rights, sustainability, and how businesses work. We had some wonderful designs that students saw on the product stage including pet rocks, wax melts, dog and rabbit treats, and some beautiful key chains and pen pots. Students also practised the social skills needed to work collaboratively with others and engage confidently with adults they were not familiar with.

Parents and carers were invited in to see all the hard work that had gone into creating the range of products on offer and to spend a few pounds! It was a great success and raised over £300 pounds for a number of chosen charities.

#### **Youth Summit Visit**

World Book Day saw a range of themes this year from War Horse by Michael Morpurgo, where students 'neighed' responses from horse head hoods, to Alice in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll.

Students at East are creating strong reading identities, through embedded DEAR time as part of the morning literacy routine throughout the school, and Accelerated Reader in KS3. Non-fiction texts are increasingly popular amongst the boys, and a range of 'dyslexia friendly' options have helped to make reading accessible and enjoyable for all.
