I will start by celebrating our Y11 students who have just completed their GCSE exams and will very soon be leaving us. It fills me with great pride to say that this year, more of our students than ever before sat exams and will leave us with qualifications. This term 87 pupils from Years 9. 10 and 11 were entered for one or more examinations which is the highest number since we opened. The exams taken by the students ranged over 12 different qualifications, some of which we ran for the first time. As well as the Maths. **English Science** usual and qualifications, students this year sat exams in Art, Music, Design Technology, Sports and Engineering. In addition to these exams we had students enter in a number of non-exam qualifications in areas such as Personal Growth and Wellbeing, PE and Art and Design.

Of course we hope that all our students get good results but sitting these exams is a fantastic achievement in its own right, whatever the outcome may be. We all know how worrying and stressful sitting tests and exams can be and being brave enough to come in and give them your best effort is the first step to success. All those young people demonstrated the resilience and courage to have a go that we want to develop in every single one of our young people.

All of that also goes for our Yr6's who took their SATs at the same time. It can be even more challenging for our younger students to do these tests and again, sitting them at all is an achievement itself, whatever the outcome. Well done to them all and to the staff for supporting them through it. We of course, wish our Y11's who are moving on, good luck and success in their next steps in life.

As we go into the long summer holiday I wish you all a very happy, peaceful and safe break on behalf of all of us at Springwell Leeds. We look forward to seeing you all in September. The new term starts with a training day on Monday 4th of September, when school will be closed to all pupils. We then have parent review meetings on Tuesday 5th of September - details for these will come to you directly from the site that your child attends. Volunteering

This has been the first year we have run the Duke of Edinburgh Award as an option choice and it has been a wonderful journey for the students and staff involved with this creating valuable and memorable experiences for our young people. Throughout the award students developed new skills, found motivation, overcame personal challenges, found confidence and resilience and achieved things they thought they could not all whilst raising awareness of important causes and helping others.

We began our volunteering journey in our first term, continuing this through into the winter term, when many people and families in the UK and in the local area were facing an economic crisis and facing a winter of hardship. It did not take very long before a group of students felt they would like to spend their volunteering section supporting one our local foodbanks. The foodbank was something that was very personal to some of the students, as one student discussed to the group that they remember a time previously in their life when they had struggled and needed support.

They spent time working as a team, exploring why foodbanks would be a good charity to support, researching why there was an increase in the usage of foodbanks, and discovering what local foodbanks were in their areas before finally deciding which ones to support with donations.

Throughout this period students then organised various fundraising events in school for foodbank donations and continued to contact many local supermarkets asking for direct support and raised a wonderful amount of donations for the Trussell Trust Leeds North & Dorth & West, who were extremely thankful for the support.

In addition to this we also had students who gave up their time to work in local charity shops, helping out at animal shelters and mentoring our younger students in sports skills.

It has been wonderful to watch the students develop these volunteering journeys themselves and take pride in their achievements and be part of something that meant so much to them and to see them grow and give back

to their local communities.

We investigated balanced and unbalanced using a leaf blower and beach ball along with various other practical and engaging science experiments.


Then we looked at how an aeroplane wing creates lift using a toilet roll, the effects were quite dramatic!

Community Support

Generous community support for Springwell's Music Technology Offer

Over the past few years we have seen an increased interest in student's interest in learning and developing DJ skills and, earlier this year, the Music department made the decision to seek opportunities to enhance this offer further.

In March 2023 we were delighted to receive a grant from the Universal Music UK Sound Foundation as a result of a successful application to their fund. Following this award we made contact with Bop DJ, a DJ and Music Production Technology specialist based in Leeds, and shared our wish list. Two questions were posed to the company:

- How much would our wish list cost?
- How much could we get with our funding?

So we could adequately resource our three Leeds sites we were looking for a number of DJ controllers as well as licences for the DJ software and we quickly found we would need our budget to stretch quite far! Andy, the general manager at Bop DJ, told us that Bop DJ are passionate about supporting local schools interested in incorporating DJ-ing in their curriculum and that they would look to put together a special offer for Springwell Leeds.

Within the week Andy came back to us having been in touch with 'InMusic' (owner of Numark) and 'Serato' (who produce the DJ software) on behalf of the school. As a result, Bop DJ made us an offer that ensured we could secure all the equipment we required for all three sites that worked to our budget.

We were delighted to take delivery of the DJ controllers last month and are now in the process of setting up the Serato accounts.

We would like to extend our thanks to the Universal Music UK Sound Foundation for their support and offer particular thanks to Andy at Bop DJ for his incredible support of our Music curriculum. We encourage anyone with an interest in DJ-ing or Music Production to visit the Bop DJ shop on Church Walk in Leeds or support them in any way possible.
